

Minimum Requirements for TRMA Contractor IH Programs

Contractors are responsible for the health and safety of their employees by assessing and managing the health hazards created by or within the scope of their work activity.

1. Contractors must have a written Industrial Hygiene (IH) program included as part of their comprehensive Safety & Health program. The IH program shall include an exposure assessment process when the scope of the work has the potential for significant exposure to a health hazard.

Health hazards include chemicals, biological agents, noise, heat, and radiation.

2. When an assessment is required, the Contractor shall have:
 - a. A Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) readily available to provide program oversight; and
 - b. IH Awareness trained personnel available at the site.
3. All exposure assessment results and reports shall be shared by the Contractor with the host facility.
