Three Rivers IH Awareness Training Class

The 4 hour fundamentals class is designed to provide front line supervisors and site safety representatives a basic level of knowledge around workplace health hazards and assessment. At least one person at a site should be able to identify and understand basic health issues.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the potential impact of chemical and physical agents on the short and long term health of workers
- Understand the basics of exposure assessments and how the results can be used at the worksite for job planning and safety communications.
- To be able to recognize when there may be a potential for excessive exposure and actions that may need to be taken to address the risk.
- To be able to effectively audit worksite conditions against health program requirements.
